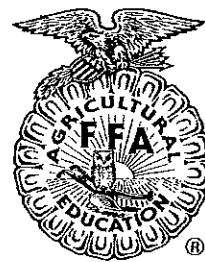
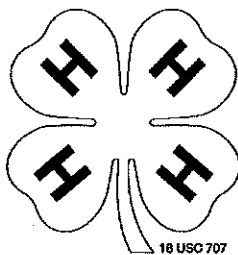


72nd Annual Grant County Junior Fair

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. Premiums offered herein are open to all Grant County residents who are of school age (grades pre-K through 12) and/or 4-H and FFA members.**
- 2. No more than a total of two market steers, two prospect steers, three market hogs, three market lambs, two heifers, three wether goats, and three doe goats may be entered by one exhibitor.**
- 3. Exhibits must have been continuously owned and fed personally by the exhibitor by the Oklahoma Youth Expo/Grant County nomination deadline per species.**
- 4. Exhibitors must care for and show their own animals in the ring. If for any reason this is impossible, notify the person or persons in charge and they will select a substitute.**
- 5. Exhibitor showing animal, the judge, and show officials are the only ones allowed in the show ring during judging. Otherwise an exhibitor may be disqualified.**
- 6. Lambs, hogs, goats and steers will be weighed according to weighing schedule.**
- 7. The prospect classes will be judged on their prospects of development into market animals of the desirable type for show. Prospect exhibits are those weighing less than: *sheep - 70 lb.; goats—50 lb.; swine - 175 lb.; beef - 999 lb.***
- 8. Animals in prospect classes are not eligible for premium sale**
- 9. Livestock must be entered by 10:00am and weighed by fairboard members at time of weigh-in Thursday, February 22. Livestock will be released following the selection for sale order by species.**
- 10. Weight classes on sheep, steers, goats and hogs will not be determined until after all the animals are entered and weighed. Classes will be determined by weighing committee.**

11. **Each breed must have four head minimum to justify a breed champion and reserve, or 2 minimum to justify a champion. Single entry breed divisions will be able to show for overall grand champion and reserve grand champion but will not be guaranteed a place in the sale line-up. Single entry breeds that will be allowed in the overall grand drive are as follows:**
 - a. **Sheep: Dorset, Southdown, Speckle, Shropshire, Hampshire, Natural, and Crossbred.**
 - b. **Swine: Berkshire, Chester, Duroc, Hampshire, Poland, Spot, York, and Crossbred.**
 - c. **Cattle: Angus, Hereford, Shorthorn, and Crossbred**
12. **Exhibitors will be wholly responsible for their exhibit throughout the show.**
13. **In showing for champions, second place animals in same class as champions will be eligible to show for reserve.**
14. **All swine, steers, goats and lambs must have ear tags in place upon arrival in compliance with nomination rule. If ear tag is not evident animals may be disqualified. If ear tag is lost please contact superintendent prior to arrival on fairgrounds.**
15. **Exhibitor's number must be worn by the exhibitor in plain sight while showing in order to qualify for the showmanship awards, except for sheep and goats. Each exhibitor will be given an exhibitor's number and all livestock shown by one exhibitor must be entered at one time.**
16. **Heifer exhibitors will be required to show registration papers during entry indicating exhibitor as owner. Exhibitors must maintain continuous ownership, possession and provide daily care 60 or more days before the opening of the show.**
17. **All exhibitors will receive a ribbon.**

RULES AND REGULATIONS CONT

- 18. No fungicides/insecticides allowed to be used in an airborne manner in the barns. Only water based grooming products will be allowed for hogs, no oil based products.**
- 19. Protest Rule: A protest must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of \$200.00 payable to the Grant County Fair Board. Protest must state clearly the complaint or appeal and be submitted to the Grant County Fair Board before the premium auction selection is made. The decision of the Grant County Fair Board is final. Deposit will not be returned if the protest is not sustained.**
- 20. The Grant County Fair Board has adopted the Oklahoma 4-H and FFA Show Ring Code of Ethics. A copy is available in the show office, from each local FFA Advisor, or from each member of the Grant County Fair Board. Exhibitors and parents are encouraged to read, understand and comply with the Show Ring Code of Ethics.**
- 21. To participate in the current Grant County Junior Fair youth must have an entry in the previous Grant County Fall Free Fair.**
- 22. All livestock, market and breeding, to be exhibited in the 2018 Grant County Junior Fair must be nominated. Two nomination procedures are accepted: 1) Oklahoma Youth Expo or 2) Grant County Fair Board. Nomination deadline for the 2018 Grant County Junior Fair is December 7th, following OYE deadlines and rules. Heifers must be nominated (registration papers show exhibitor as owner by December 24, 2017 (60 days prior to the opening day of the 2018 Grant County Junior Fair). Prospect steers are the only animals not required to be nominated.**
- 23. The Fair Board will assign pens for all species by school beginning with the 2012 Grant County Junior Fair.**

The minimum weight shall be 50 pounds. There will be no maximum weight.

Classes will be divided by weights. Class winners will compete for Champ. and Reserve Goat.

Artificial coloring, paint, or powder will not be permitted for use on goats. Any attempt to alter animal color or characteristics is prohibited.

Length of Doe Goat hair is left up to the discretion of the exhibitor. Meat Goat entries must be sheared to a maximum of 3/8 of an inch residual hair length.

Bracing will be allowed in the wether goat division. All four feet MUST be left on the ground.

Bracing of doe goats will not be tolerated and will result in dismissal by the judge or superintendent. Doe goats must have all four feet on the ground. Doe goats must be shown with a collar/chain used only to control the animal. Exhibitor can only transiently touch the animal with his body. Exhibitor cannot use the collar to make the animal tense her muscles. Any violation will result in dismissal.

LAMBS

Superintendents: Beth Hendrick

Lambs will be weighed and placed into equal classes determined by the superintendent. Lambs showing evidence of cross breeding will be entered in the crossbred class. All lambs must weigh a minimum of 70 pounds. Lambs weighing less than 70 pounds will show as prospect lambs.

Slick shear rule applies to sheep as defined by State Stock Show rules.

All ewe lambs must be individually identified with a USDA tag and /or scrapie flock certification program tag.

Hogs will be weighed and placed in equal classes with minimum weight being 175 pounds. Hogs showing evidence of crossbreeding will be entered in crossbred class.

ALL SWINE EXHIBITS MUST PRESENT NEGATIVE TEST RESULTS FOR PSUEDORABIES & BRUCellosIS CONDUCTED AFTER 12-1-2017 TO SHOW OFFICIAL AND IDENTIFYING 840/IED EARTAG MUST BE IN PLACE BEFORE UNLOADING. All swine exhibitors must provide a Premise Identification Number.

When only one breed does not meet the (4) head AOB requirement: For a swine breed with 2 or 3 head shown, champions are guaranteed a spot in the sale. For a swine breed with less than 2, champions are not guaranteed a spot in the sale. Sale order for this breed(s) will be selected by quality in the crossbred sale order as determined by the swine judge.

CATTLE

Superintendent: Jim Blaser, Phil Ransom

Steers to be weighed and placed in classes of equal number. All breeds shown separately. Steers will be shown in this order - Angus, Hereford, Shorthorn, AOB and Crossbred.

Beef show will be Blow and Show. The use of paint, glue/adhesives and boning soaps will not be allowed. Any attempt to alter animal color or breed characteristics including the addition of hair or other added materials natural or man-made (excluding false tail switches) is prohibited.

HEIFERS

NOTE: Heifer must be nominated for the Grant County Junior Fair by having registration papers showing exhibitor as owner along with tattoos 60 days prior to the opening day of the Grant County Junior Fair. Angus, Hereford, Polled Hereford, Shorthorn and all other breeds (shown separately) in this order.

YOUTH EXPO CONTESTS

Youth Expo Showmanship: Beef & Swine—1) must sign up when exhibits are entered; 2) judge will select delegate and alternate to represent Grant County

Youth Expo Cattle Trimming Contest: 1) must sign up when exhibits are entered; 2) if more than one team enters the Junior Fair, Beef Committee will determine a process to select the team to represent Grant County.

LIVESTOCK JUDGING CONTEST

Saturday, February 24th 9am

4-H and FFA members may compete as individuals and teams. Awards will be presented at the Premium Auction on February 25, 6:30 pm. Trophies will be presented to the high 4-H & FFA team, and top three 4-H & FFA individuals.

Premium Auction Guidelines

- 1) 67 animals will be selected for the Premium Auction as follows: 20 hogs, 16 beef, 19 lambs, 5 wether goats, 2 heifers, 5 Doe goats with open slots to be distributed on a percentage basis to remaining species.
- 2) Animals are selected for the premium auction by the beef, sheep, goat and swine judge. The Premium Auction scratch list shall be as follows grand champion, reserve grand champion, then the remaining champions and reserve champions selected based on quality (reserve champions will be pulled into the lineup when the champion is selected and may be in the lineup with champions until all champions and reserve champions are placed on the premium auction scratch list).
- 3) An exhibitor may have one animal in the premium auction per year. If an exhibitor has more than one animal on the premium auction scratch list the exhibitor must decide which animal they will place in the premium auction and scratch (draw a line through their name) any other(s) they have on the list and write their initials by their name.
- 4) Exhibitors will have 30 minutes following the conclusion of the beef show to make scratch(es). The scratch lists will be posted on the bulletin board on the east wall of the show office.
- 5) All animals are released following the selection of animals for the premium auction list. Animals that will be in the premium auction must be brought back to the fairgrounds before the premium auction.
- 6) The premium auction is a bonus sale. Exhibitors maintain ownership of their animals.
- 7) Only the Supreme and Reserve Supreme Heifers qualify for the premium auction.
